

Rev. Moshay Moses

Interfaith Holistic Ministry

Rev. Moshay Moses, a woman of transgender experience, studied fashion design at the Fashion Institute of Technology. For 20 years she worked as a fashion and costume designer.

In 1996 Rev. Moses began a new career as an advocate for the transgender community, while also ministering to the community at large. She is currently an Advocate/Case Manager at Positive Health Project (PHP) specializing in promoting health awareness among Transgender people with an emphasis on direct assistance to sex workers. Foremost within her work is her consistent advocacy on behalf of "human rights" for people of Transgender experience, bringing attention to the whole person -- body, mind and spirit. Rev. Moses currently facilitates support groups at Midtown Community Court, Positive Health Project (PHP), Metropolitan Community Church (MCC-NY).

Rev. Moshay Moses is President and Founder of FASHION ON GENDER, a not- for profit clothing bank designed to assist women of transgender experience transition to living full time as women in society. FASHION ON GENDER provides clothing, workshops, and referrals.

On October 27, 2007 Reverend Moshay Moses was ordained in the Sanctuary of the Beloved under the Order of Melchizedek. Rev. Moses strongly believes in empowerment of the transgender community. She will continue to educate and advocate until equality is gained by a united community.

Awards & Recognitions

On January 12, 2001 Rev. Moses received a Certificate of Appreciation from New York City's High School of Graphic Communication Arts at its *Keeping the Dream Alive Dr King Peace Symposium* on equality and justice, for special service in the development of youth.

In December 2007 Reverend Moshay Moses appeared on National PBS's *In the Life* documentary, *Building On the Past*, which celebrates its amazing archive looking back at some of the people and places the series has introduced to the viewing public over the past 16 years.

On February 23, 2008 Reverend Moshay Moses was awarded the first annual "Unity through Diversity" award at the New York State LGBT People of Color Health Summit in Albany, New York in recognition of her efforts for improving and maintaining the health and well-being of the Transgender Community.

Rev. Moshay Moses received a Proclamation from Manhattan Borough President C. Virginia Fields in recognition of her efforts to empower the Transgender Community.
