Bringing H.O.P.E. to Everyone

Sister-to-Sister

★ This unique program equips women to bring the message of HIV prevention to other women (family, friends, church members, etc.) in their neighborhoods. Backed by full and free training and support, these peer educators can even earn a stipend for their efforts. Educators may be invited to speak at meetings or simply distribute materials in their place of business, salons, coffee houses and shops.

Health Care Forums

★ Since rates of HIV and STD infections are especially high among women, special prevention pamphlets are offered through local gynecologists and other women's health care providers. Health care providers are also encouraged to include a brief sexual health questionnaire (provided by the Alliance) with every patient visit.

Fatherhood Workshops

★ Open to any man desiring to be a better father or father figure, these workshops are held throughout the year to address a variety of parental concerns, including assistance on speaking to their children about HIV/STDs prevention.

HIV Prevention Case Management

★ Preventive case managers provide the counseling and referral services you need to help lower your chance of contracting HIV/AIDS. By accessing needed resources, this component can empower at-risk persons to improve their quality of life.

Community Advisory Committee

★ Church and community leaders, health and human service providers, and other interested individuals work closely with AIDS Community Resources to ensure that H.O.P.E. Alliance programs are culturally sensitive and effective in reaching out to their neighborhoods. Take a look at contributing your time and input to this valuable committee.
